## Key Focus Questions - Ngaa Paatai Arotahi Matua

Who are the people in my family? -

Ko wai maa te hunga o taku whaanau?

He aha aa raatou mahi?

- What is a Paatere? How is a Paatere performed? He aha aa raatou mahi?
- What do they do? -Who are the people in my community, hapu, Iwi? -
  - Ko wai maa te hunga o taku hapori, o taku hapuu, o taku iwi?
- When is it appropriate to perform a Paatere?

- What do they do? -How important are these people in the groups I belong to?
  - He peehea te mana o eenei taangata i roto i aku roopuu?
- Why do people perform -Paatere?

### Suggested Learning Activities - Ngaa mahi ako - Hei Whakaaro Pea

Place pictures of your family onto a large sheet of paper, Beside each picture write down their name, age, what they do and how important they are to you Discuss the roles and responsibilities that people have in

- the community? Identify the rangatira (chiefs) of -Ngaati Whanaunga and describe their roles and responsibilities?

# Key Focus Questions - Ngaa Paatai Arotahi Matua

He aha teenei mea te paatere?

- He peehea te whakaputa i te

- ki te kawe i te paatere?
  He aha te iwi e whakaputa ai i te paatere?

What is a habitat? -

- Where do these living things stay? What do they need to live there? -
- He aha teenei mea te noohanga?
- Ka noho eenei mea ora ki hea?
  - He aha ngaa mea e hiahia ana raatou maa raatou i teenei ao?

### Suggested Learning Activities - Ngaa mahi ako - Hei Whakaaro Pea

- Takina, whakaaturia hoki te paatere Kei whea te Aute?
- Titoa he whiunga aa-tinana hei whakaahua i te moana, i ngaa maunga, i te whenua, i ngaa awa, me eeraa atu mea

Classify living things according to their habitats

Draw pictures of different animals - and plants and place them onto large murals that show where they live

Write a brief explanation as to why they live there -

- Whakaroopuutia ngaa mea ora katoa, araa, me whakaroopuu aanoohanga.
- Tuhia he pikitia o ngaa kararehe me ngaa otaota rerekee, ka whakatakoto ai ki ngaa pikitia pakitara o taua whakaaturanga e noho raa raatou Tuhia he whakamaarama poto moo te aahua o too raatou noho i reira
